The "Education UK Guidebook 2014-2015" is a British Council publication with a strong focus on Japanese students' needs. The British Council will be responsible for the main content. Japanese publisher Keibunsha will carry out the editing and production. This guidebook has been annually published since 2000 and is well recognized by Japanese institutions.

The printed version of the guidebook will be distributed widely to Japanese students and institutions, whereas the on-line version will be available on the British Council Japan's website.

Distribution plan (printed version)

- 1. 5,000 copies will be distributed to individual visitors to the British Council office in Japan and at British Council events.
- 2. 10,000 copies will be sent to 1000 secondary schools and 100 junior colleges throughout Japan. Additional copies will be delivered on request.
- 3. 150 universities will receive the number of copies they request.
- 4. A sample copy will be sent to each of 60 municipal and prefectural international offices. Additional copies will be delivered on request.
- 5. Over 2,000 copies will be distributed to educational agents and study abroad related service providers for use with their customers.

^{*} The distribution list for the guidebook gets updated each year according to the results of surveys of secondary schools and colleges in Japan.

On-line version

An on-line version of the guidebook will be available on the British Council Japan's Education UK website in easy-to-view PDF format. The Education UK website currently receives an average of 30,000 visits a month.

How the guidebook has been used at Japanese institutions

- Many of the Japanese institutions that receive our guidebook give away copies to students who visit their international office and /or career guidance office.
- A number of institutions (mainly universities) hold their own study abroad events and distribute 50-200 copies at each event.
- Some teachers use the guidebook in their class to introduce foreign culture to their students.
- Some of the municipal government international offices hold study aboard or cultural exchange events and distribute our guidebook to visitors to these events.
