





National Education Plan (PNE)

approved June 2014

Targets:

Higher Education

- Raise the gross enrolment ratio in higher education to 50% of the population between 18 and 24 years, ensuring its quality, and expand enrolment in the public sector by at least 40%.
- Ensure that at least 75% of professors are MA/MSc holders and 35% PhD holders.
- Expand enrolment in postgraduate programmes to meet annual output of 60K masters and 25K PhDs.

Investment

- Reach, in ten years, the equivalent investment of 10% of GDP on public education.

Royalties Law

approved September 2013


- 75% of oil royalties and 50% of the surplus oil in pre-salt will be gradually available for education.


Additional amount available to education (Royalties) - R\$-bi










Performance of SwB 1.0

Distribution of scholarships implemented by country of destination (Top 5)





- To encourage the learning of the English language, providing a wide and structural change in the teaching of foreign languages in universities.




LwB programme - English

Examples of possible offerings

- Professional development experiences: secondments, job shadowing, internships, special projects. Pre-existing schemes or new, tailor-made professional opportunities in specific areas. These schemes can involve work experiences in one or more departments in your organisation, or even other partnering institutions
- CULTURE BRASIL CONNECTION UNITED KINGDOM
- Educational opportunities: short courses, seminars, technical training schemes
- <u>Artistic development</u>: artistic residencies and opportunities for artistic collaborations with one or more British artists/companies
- Existing relationships and partnerships: if you have existing partnerships or collaborations with a specific Brazilian artist, group of artists, or institution, these can also benefit from the programme. Once your organisation has designed a specific collaboration opportunity, you can encourage your partner in Brazil to apply for the programme's funding.

*Accessibility costs comprise of additional financial support for travel expenses and professional fees of caretakers and/or sign language translators accompanying Deaf and Disabled artists.



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The Fund will cover three broad categories of activity:

British Council Brazil

- People: capacity building, people exchange and joint centres;
- Programmes: research collaborations on development topics; and
- Translation: innovation partnerships

Brazil Budget: £ 9 million/year x 3 years (2014-2017)

How does NF work?

Promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries - Official Development Assistance (ODA) requirement through <u>science</u> and technology

Project must be locally-driven: reflects local needs

Projects can happen either in Brazil or in the UK

Open and transparent funding: everything we fund must be chosen through an open, transparent and competitive process

Newton Researcher Links

Travel grants (between 1 month and 6 months)

Grants for bilateral workshops aligned with the in-country Newton Fund priority areas and designed for UK and partner country researchers to share their research and establish relationships for longer term collaboration

Status: call closed 20th Nov. Selection processes ongoing

2 calls for 2015; one in each semester





Netwon Institutional Links

2 year grants to initiate new research and innovation partnerships between groups, departments and institutions in partner countries and the UK

Develop existing partnerships at group, departmental and institutional level

Establish local hubs for UK-partner country activity in a particular research area, enabling engagement from the wider research community

Status: call closed 20th Nov. Selection processes ongoing

2 calls for 2015: one in each semester

STEM Education Programme

STEM curriculum development – focus on basic education

Partnerships for STEM resource development

Pilot innovative approaches to formal and informal STEM learning, for example by establishing a national STEM Ambassadors network,

Summer programme for school students at UK unis or research institutes (immersion)

Status: call under negotiation for 2015 – not sure yet





Technical Training and Employability Programme

Support in develop new curriculum to match industry needs

Apprenticeship pilot scheme for laboratory technicians

Supporting dialogue and partnerships in TVET

Internship schemes in UK universities and businesses

Status: call under negotiation for 2015 – not sure yet

<u>Professional Development and Engagement Programme</u>

Skills training for research management – focus on Brazilian academics

Best practice sharing, training and study tours and work shadowing for senior research managers/policymakers/SME leaders

Engaging researchers with end-users - support for community engagement and research-policy interface

Status: negotiating a call for 38 workshops for the Researcher Connect programme under negotiation with funding agencies in Brazil










Percentage of GDP invested in Education in Mexico.








