- Encouragement for foreign investments




#### WHY SAUDI ARABIA

- One of the world's 25 largest economies (23rd) and the largest economy in the MENA region
- One of the world's fastest growing countries: per capita income is forecasted to rise from \$20,700 in 2007 to \$33,500 by 2020
- Represents 25% of total Arab GDP
- It has 25% of world's oil reserves
- Significant unmet demands exist at every level of the Saudi educational system
- Demographically, Saudi Arabia's population is extremely young and growing rapidly, with millions of school-age children
- Fast-rising personal wealth is bringing world-class education within reach of many Saudi families



### **EXPENDITURE ON EDUCATION**

- Expenditure on education and training increased in 2014 by 3%, (GBP 35 billion (SR210 billion)
- GBP 3.6 billion (SR22 billion) was allocated for Saudi students studying abroad and their families.

#### **LOCAL EDUCATION SYSTEM**

- School system breaks down into three stages: primary, intermediate and secondary
- All education is free and is compulsory from the age of six
- All schools are single sex
- More than 5 million students attended schools in general education in 2013
- Increasing number of private national and international schools.
- After secondary school young people then go on to a college or a university at 18.

The higher education system has seen considerable growth in recent years and now comprises:

- 24 government universities (a few of which now appear in world university rankings)
- 18 primary teacher colleges for men
- 80 primary teacher colleges for women
- 35 male technical colleges, 14 female high technical institutes
- 37 colleges and institutes for health
- 9 private universities and colleges
- Introduction of PYP
- National Commission of Academic Accreditation and Assessment

### **KSA IN RELATION TO ELT MARKETS**

Number of student weeks from Rest of Middle East in last two years: 232549.

An increase from the 8<sup>th</sup> biggest market in 2012 to the third biggest in 2013.

Number of student weeks from Saudi in the last two years: 221247

For just 2013, Italy had 236,061 weeks and Saudi and the Middle East 242,306 so combined for the last year it has been the biggest!

All of the other top five markets have shown declines over the past few years whereas the Middle East is showing steady growth.





#### **AGENTS IN KSA**
