Introduction

The International School Tour 2014 in Indonesia took place in 2 cities; Jakarta and Surabaya. The tour directly approaches the students and parents from host schools. They are the key audience in giving UK education prominence as well as to raise more awareness to Education UK in Indonesia.

There were 1261 students and 55 parents attended the International School Tour from 7 host schools in Jakarta and Surabaya. Feedback from the school counsellors, students and UK universities representatives attending in overall was positive. Presentations on various related topics such as Tips on writing your UCAS Personal Statement as well as the brief Institution profiles were held throughout the tour, and were also well attended.

British Council Indonesia undertook a review of the Tour to identify what went well, what did not go well, and the key 'lessons learnt' to inform future activities. With feedbacks from exhibitors and visitors, together with inputs from British Council colleagues, this post-event report presents the results of that review.




The visitors were mainly students and parents.


Counsellors' Feedback


We have received feedback from 7 Host Schools Counsellors.





The counsellors are mostly strongly agreed that the International School Tour has met their expectations and built new links and relationships.







The counsellors are mostly very satisfied and satisfied with the supports given by the British Council before and during the tour and for future relationship.


Students' Feedback


We have received feedback from 44 Students attending the International School Tour events.




- The tour in Non Jakarta schools should be arranged at the end of the trip

Exhibitors' Feedback


We have received 11 feedbacks out of 14 UK Exhibitors for the International School Tour 2014.




The Exhibitors are mostly strongly agreed and agreed that the International School Tour has met their expectation and 27% neither agree nor disagree.

Future steps

There are several areas that both British Council and the UK institutions can work on to improve the overall arrangement and outcomes of the tour. The main findings and recommended next steps are outlined below:

British Council

- British Council should reach more schools that are keen with UK Education as well as inviting national plus/public schools.
- Reconsider Surabaya International School
- Better time arrangement between Jakarta and Non Jakarta schools.
- Inform counsellors to communicate the University highlights before events and increase promotions

UK institutions

- All exhibitors should comply with the policies and deadlines given by the British Council for the tour (eg. Returned the forms).
- Parents and students are interested in common issues faced by their experienced counterparts in Indonesia, and value their advice on how to overcome them. So, it is suggested that institutions can invite their alumni to attend the event and share their life in UK with the visitors.
