## **BEIJING STATEMENT**

A Statement of Principles for Quality Assurance of UK-China Transnational Education

## **Preamble**

Based on shared interest and commitment to enhancing the quality and safeguarding the standards of UK-China Transnational Education (TNE), and a partnership approach to external quality assurance, representatives from both the UK and China agreed this 'Statement of Principles' on the occasion of the Quality Assurance for UK-China Transnational Education conference, held in Beijing on 18th March 2016.

This document is not legally binding on any of the parties that contributed to the conference. It does mark a commitment to cooperation and collaboration on both sides, and to deepen and strengthen partnership in quality assurance of transnational education.

## Overview

All parties recognise that UK-China Transnational Education:

- Is integral to positive education relations, academic and student exchange, national and regional development between and within the two countries;
- Is most successful and sustainable when structured for mutual benefit;
- Benefits from continuing co-operation at institutional and national levels to enhance quality assurance;
- Encourages and develops excellence and innovation in teaching and learning within individual institutions and across partnerships.

## **Quality Assurance**

All parties agree this statement in the spirit of the joint-working and "collaboration in quality assurance for transnational education" expressed through the 2015 UK - China Partners in Education Framework.

- We believe that transnational education is a critical element of higher education, nurturing talent, creativity and productivity. Sharing best practice and experience on quality assurance between the UK and China delivers a valuable contribution to a strong higher education relationship.
- We recognise that the primary responsibility for enhancing the quality and safeguarding the standards of transnational education lies with individual institutions and programmes.
- 3. We agree that national and international policy dialogues and research should be encouraged, and are a key component of transnational education quality enhancement.
- 4. We agree that cooperation and collaboration at institutional and national level, and with quality assurance agencies, supports a transnational education system with increased opportunity for quality enhancement.
- 5. We recognise the potential for further data and information sharing, taking into account the differing legal duties of providers in their home and host countries, which can make a positive difference to the development of stronger quality assurance relationships and environment. These benefits are to the advantage of governments, higher education institutions, students, employers and others interested parties.
- We believe that agencies involved in quality assurance, and other interested parties, should further develop regular UK-China channels of communication, facilitating future co-operation.
- 7. We commit to supporting efforts to strengthen cooperation in the quality assurance of UK-China transnational education.

The foregoing represents the understanding reached between the Participants on the occasion of the Quality Assurance for UK-China Transnational Education conference, held in Beijing on 18th March 2016.

This statement of principles is in both the English and Chinese languages, both texts having equal validity.
