## CALL FOR PAPERS

### Conference Theme

**“ICT & the Human Factor: Agents of Social and Economic Transformation.”**

This Annual Symposium combines two important events, the EduVision Conference and EdTech/e-Learning Jamaica Symposium that focus on ICT in education. The partnership brings together the Jamaica Tertiary Education Commission (J-TEC), e-Learning Jamaica, The University of the West Indies (UWI), University of Technology, Jamaica (UTech, JA), Jamaica Teachers’ Association (JTA), HEART Trust NTA and ICT-4D.

The three-day symposium provides the opportunity for educators, industry leaders and policymakers to discuss the status of learning in the areas of, curriculum design, policy, teaching, professional development and teaching and learning strategies. The sessions will examine the direction and progress that Jamaica has made and strategies to overcome current and impending challenges. ### Selection process

Submissions will be reviewed by a panel consisting of educators, ICT professionals and researchers who are part of the EduVision/e-LJam planning committee.

### Submission guidelines

Proposals for papers should include the following

- Presentation Title
- Presenter(s) full name, affiliation(s) and contact details
- Objectives and scope of the presentation
- Sub-theme
- Abstracts should provide information in the following areas;
  - Key issues to be addressed
  - Objective and scope of the presentation
  - Relevance of the presentation to the conference theme
  - Impact of the work and practical applicability to Jamaica
  - Type of research: survey, case study, historical analysis, exploratory paper
- Language: English
- Paper Length: At least 5 pages (excluding works cited/bibliography)
- Spacing: Double
- Font: Times New Roman, 12 point
- Word Citation style: APA



All presentations will be released to the conference website for public viewing. Full papers may be requested from the authors.

- Deadline date for Submission for Abstracts: June 14, 2016
- Notification of Acceptance of Abstract July 14, 2016
- Presentations should be submitted by October 7, 2016

- Research Paper presentations and ED Tech talks -20 minutes
