Alongside the main events, a series of presentations were delivered by the Law Society of British Columbia and British Columbia Dental Association, who provided information on how to practice law or dentistry in British Columbia with a UK degree.

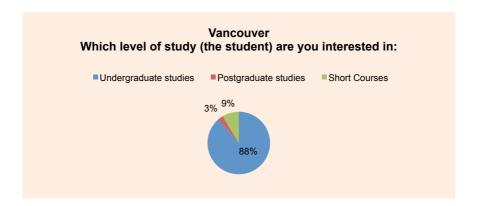

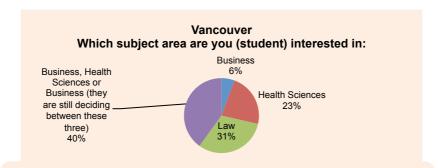

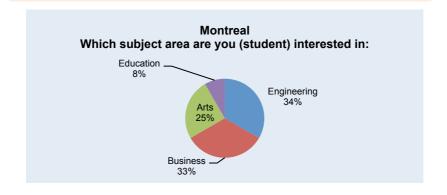


Montreal Which level of study (the student) are you interested in: Postgraduate

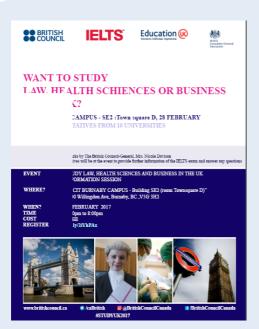

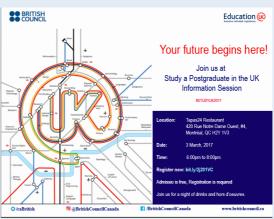

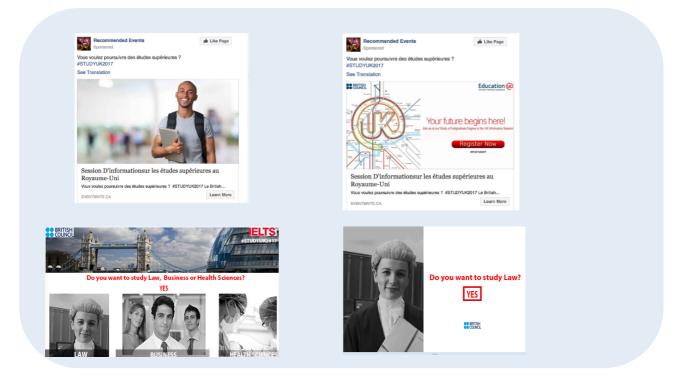
Marketing Campaign:

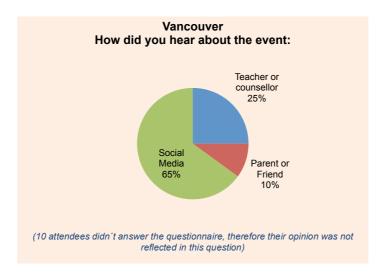

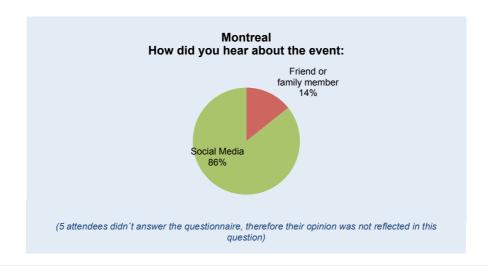

5 strongly agree, 4 agree, 1 neither agree or disagree (2 UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

When the exhibitors were asked, what went well and should be repeated:

- The presentations from the professional bodies were excellent and should be repeated; however perhaps these
 could be held in a separate room, so that they are targeted only at the relevant students. That said, they were
 certainly interesting for the university.
- Having an expert in the area of Law delivering a session to attendees

(4 UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

Montreal

When the exhibitors were asked, what went well and should be repeated:

The attendees were all very focussed on PG and would be great potential students for the UK.
 (2UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

Toronto

When the exhibitors were asked, what went well and should be repeated:

- Many counsellors and networking opportunities.
- The format and 'speed-dating' with counsellors.
- There was a good number of visitors and the session was very relevant to their enquirers. (2 UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

Vancouver

When the exhibitors were asked, what could have been better or changed:

- A less formal structure with more time for the mini fair. More contact time with the visitors, most of the visitors went next door to listen to the presentations
- The location of the venue was not idea, it was noisy and attendance was limited. The out of town location perhaps meant that attendance levels were not as expected, although the weather did not help.
- Suggestion: A weekend afternoon in Vancouver would have been preferred
- Allow longer time for university presentations.

(4 UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

Montreal

When the exhibitors were asked, what could have been better or changed:

- The venue was not well-suited to presentations, the noise levels from the restaurant were high.
- Not enough PG students
- More attention to detail in the presentation

(2 UK universities didn't answer the questionnaire, therefore their opinion was not reflected in this question)

Toronto

When the exhibitors were asked, what could have been better or changed:

- Allow counsellors to move, rather than the universities.
- Be stricter with timing and have a wider room layout
- It was an early start 8.30am especially for those coming in from the GTA beyond.
- Better catering
- · Presentations should be kept to max three
- Suggestion: to have a UCAS/Personal statement presentation.

Future steps

There are several areas that both British Council and the UK institutions can work on to improve the overall arrangement and outcomes of the exhibition. The main findings and recommended next steps are outlined below:

British Council

- British Council understands the importance of providing value-added services to the exhibitors, thus for next year
 events, we will evaluate the cost effectiveness and the feasibility of choosing other venue options.
- Going forward, British Council Canada will better coordinate our event agenda to enable exhibitors more time to communicate and showcase their programs.

UK Institutions

- It is suggested that institutions invite their alumni to attend future exhibitions and share tales of their life in UK with the
 visitors
- We will advise UK universities to share further information of the admission requirements for Medicine and other relevant information of students' experiences abroad and/or extracurricular activities.
- Many visitors (students and counsellors) commented that scholarships opportunities were very low. We recommend
 institutions to look at ways of providing some sort of scholarship or discount and highlight these during future
 exhibitions.

The above points, though important, should not detract from what was a successful exhibition. Next year's events will build upon the lessons learned in these events. We hope to see you there!
