





A Cleaner Breath for a Healthier Life - The Importance of Air Quality Research in Urban Environments

The Greater Tokyo Area is the world's most populated metropolis, home to nearly 40 million people, which makes keeping the air clean a major challenge for public health and safety. In this session, Tomoaki Okuda, Associate Professor at the Keio University Leading-edge Laboratory of Science and Technology, will showcase his innovative technique for measuring atmospheric particulate matter (such as PM2.5), the first step to achieving and maintaining cleaner, healthier, more breathable cities.

The Japanese language has long fascinated scholars from all over the world. One of its most interesting features is the window it offers onto Japanese culture.
