MEASUREMENT & REPORTING

The Future of Work in the 4th Industrial Revolution:

- 85% of jobs that will exist in 2030 haven't been invented yet and 65% of children starting school will one day hold jobs that do not exist now*
- Soft skills will separate us from the robots
- How will we measure soft skill competency?

Competency Based Education (CBE) will come to the fore

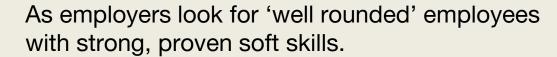
- Western Governors University, Southern New Hampshire & Arizona State Universities.
- Combined student numbers of over 300,000. Heavily focused on Competency Based programmes.
- Focus on 'proof of mastery' of skills both soft and hard.

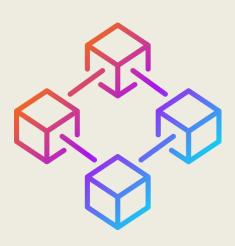

MEASUREMENT & REPORTING

Bitcoin technology is coming to Education:

- Blockchain technology will be used to 'lock in' all the 'achievements' of pupils & students.
 - Exam certificates
 - Soft skill 'masteries'
 - Extra curricular certificates





THE WAY WE LEARN

Online & blended learning will increasingly impact both ELT providers & schools

- 1. How have the US 'mega universities' grown to the size they are? Online Learning
- 2. Schools in the UK are already adopting online Learning Management Systems
 Recent launch of Harrow online & EtonX
- Enormous growth in online ELT tutoring
 VIPKid- online English tuition to 600,000 children, having raised \$825 million in funding.
 Chinese market research firm Yiou Intelligence, projects online tutoring will be an \$11.4 billion industry by 2022. (Source: EdSurge)

THE WAY WE LEARN

Online & blended learning will increasingly impact both ELT providers & Schools

Blended Learning potentially offers the most helpful way forwards. Why?

- Blended Learning- a balance between face to face and online learning providing more support for younger learners.
 - Harrow online- 6th formers only with a high level of English and academic competence.
 - Blended learning-a good model for schools looking to expand internationally.

A NEW CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT

The Growth of the Chatbots, Personalised Learning & Gaming...

Al teaching aids:

- Alexa now widely used-translation support
- Chatbots already offer personalised learning support

Gaming:

- Minecraft used in many schools to help build coding skills
- Codecombat has raised \$6 million to build a new coding skills game.
- The first version of Codecombat was used by more than 40,000 teachers in U.S (Source:EdSurge)
