The worse I feel, the more motivated I become lets Keep improving!

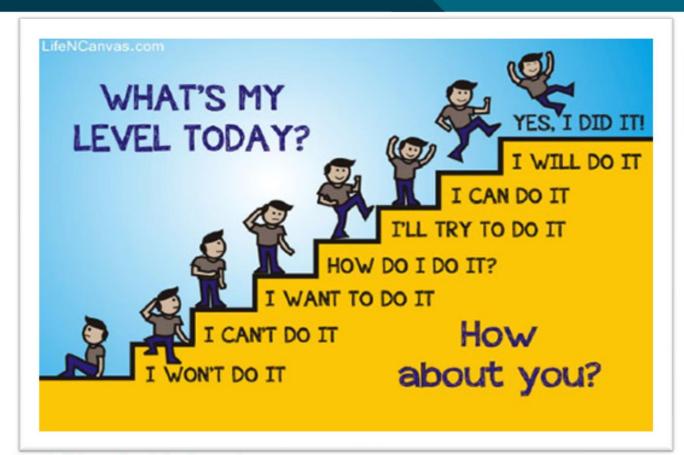
It's hard work but it's worth it!

Chart 2 - Income by source (£ thousands) 2016/17

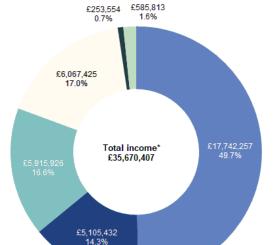

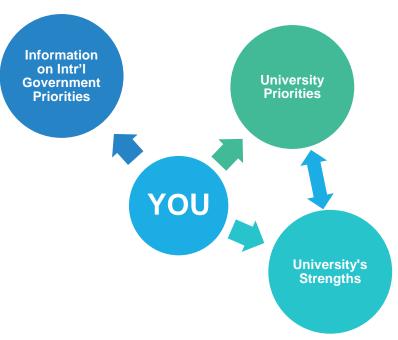

Kuwait:

Vision 2030 but now a "New Kuwait Strategy 2035 based on 7 pillars, includes \$6.6bn industrial city

Saudi Arabia:

- King Salman Programme for Human Capital Development- 500K staff to be trained by 2020.
- Irtiqa Project: 80% parents should be engaged in the learning process of their children.
- Improved healthcare service through corporatisation creating competition in public sector- vision 2030
- Lower unemployment from 11.6% to 7%- (V2030)
- Women participation in the work force from 22% to 30% (V 2030)

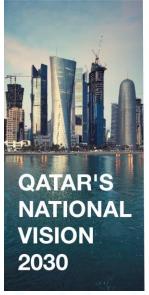
