# Feedback by UK Institutions:

- 88% UK institutions mentioned that the mission met their expectations
- 50% UK institutions mentioned that the Quality of Indian Institutions was 'Excellent' while 50% mentioned that the quality was 'Good'
- 80% UK institutions remarked that Interaction and content of the programme at Indian institutions and Support provided by the British Council was 'Good'
- 80% delegates strongly agreed that the event was a high quality event

## Comments by UK Institutions:

- We were delighted to take part in the schools mission and were pleased with the format and outcome of the visits
- 2) The mission provided useful insights on the student demographics at each school and the focus areas at each school
- 3) The tour was very useful for me to learn about IB schools in India

# Suggestions for the British Council for future missions:

- 1) Most participating institutions suggested to get more parents involved as parents are key influencers and decision makers for Undergraduate students
- 2) Some institutions suggested in providing some brief on student demographic (subjects) in advance so that the institutions can plan to carry the promotional material accordingly. We shall try and work on this aspect for future missions.
- 3) Some Institutions felt that every delegate should be given a small presentation slot of about 3 to 4 slides to introduce themselves and provide a small brief about the institution in each school. We shall look into this suggestion as the time allocated by each Indian school may not permit a brief slot for all UK delegates.
- 4) Most delegates suggested to provide a small lunch break during the day
