



Schools Mission - Gujarat - February 2013 Report

Introduction

Seven UK universities visited seven schools across the cities of Ahmedabad, Vadodara and Rajkot from 11-15 February 2013.

The focus of the mission was brand building and building a platform for Undergraduate recruitment for UK Institutions.

The programme at each school comprised a generic presentation made to the students on undergraduate study by a UK delegate followed by a table chair exhibition, a campus tour; and a faculty discussion.

In most of the schools the delegation met up with students studying in the grade XI and a few from grade XII.

The local schools were represented by school principals and senior faculty.

Day one:

(I) Ahmedabad International School: IB/CIE/GSHSEB Affiliation

About the school: Ahmedabad International school was launched in December 2000 is Gujarat State Education Board (GSEB) approved school following the GSEB curriculum, using NCERT books. The International Baccalaureate program conducted by the school runs the Primary Years Program (PYP) and the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP). The school also offers Cambridge International Examination and In addition to the IB & CIE program, the school is affiliated with Trinity College of London, which offers exams in communication skills, drama and music.

Mahatma Gandhi International School is authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organisation to offer the Middle Years Programme as well as the Diploma Programme. MGIS is Gujarat's first MYP and DP school. We are also the most senior IB school in the state. The school also offers courses in BTEC in Creative Media Production, and has an affiliation with Ed excel.

(III) New Era Senior Secondary School, Vadodara: CBSE Affiliation

New Era Senior Secondary School was formed in 1991 under the banner of The Gujarat New Era Education Trust. It is a well established school for age group from 3+ to 17+. NESSS has been at the heart of Vadodara for more than 15 years, and has had a wonderful reputation for excellence since its foundation in 1991. The school offers three streams for standard XI and XII Science, Commerce, Humanities.

Navrachana International School is administered by the 40-year old Navrachana Education Society (NES) and offers the International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme, Cambridge's International General Certificate in Secondary Education (IGCSE) and the CBSE Curriculum

Day 4:

(VII) The Rajkumar College, Rajkot: Affiliated to CBSE board

A workshop was organised with academics from 5 schools of Ahmedabad at the British Library. The programme of thee day involved presentations from the local schools and reverse presentations from the UK Universities followed by discussion to discuss recruitment.

Media personnel took quick updates on the education scenario in the UK with the delegates and spoke to a couple of delegates on the objectives and intended outcomes of the mission. Press Coverage has appeared in media.

Details of scholarships offered by Universities at UG level (GBP):

- University of Greenwich: Nationality scholarship: 1000 GBP
- Leeds Metropolitan University: 10% waiver on upfront full payment
- Kingston University: 3300 GBP for merit based for international students
- University of East Anglia: 50 % of first year tuition fee (marking 50th anniversary)
- Plymouth University: 1500 GBP for science and technology department
- University of Northampton: Up to 25 % waiver in tuition for duration of course, merit based

The faculty discussions at all schools mainly revolved around exploring avenues for summer schools, direct recruitment and waiver arrangement as per twinning programmes.

Feedback by UK Institutions:

- 1. 100% delegates remarked that the mission 'met' their objectives
- 60% mentioned that the quality of institutions captured during the mission was 'Excellent'.
- 3. 60% delegates gave feedback that the Interaction and content of the programme at institutions was 'Good'
- 4. 100% delegates found the support provided by the British Council 'Excellent'
- 5. 60% delegates 'agreed' that the mission met and their expectations and that the event was a 'high quality event'.

Comments by some UK Institutions:

- Overall the event was very fruitful. Selection of institutions was very good and the British Council team had done all the necessary groundwork. Very satisfied with the event and we should be able to build some strong contacts especially with our reasonable tuition fee and 25% scholarship scheme.
- 2. There was interesting discussion at most of the institutions about pedagogical issues, staff training and what contribution could be made by UK institutions.
- All of the institutions were very welcoming and the students all very polite and were asking good questions (what subjects they should study, entry requirements, accommodation etc.)
- 4. The schools showed great interest in understanding about studying in the UK and there was a good opportunity for us to build relationship with the school authorities / counsellors. Further visits to meet student, parents and one to one sessions with the school counsellors is the way forward for us.
- It was clearly evident from the seamless flow of events, that the mission was well
 planned and organised and a lot of effort had gone in to confirming and re-confirming
 the visits at the various schools
- 6. Pre-conceptions about IB vs CBSE schools are now ended some of the most open to options of studying at Art School were from the CBSE schools.

Suggestions for the British Council for future missions:

- 1. The British Council could organise an exclusive school fair in the future, inviting students studying in the years 11 and 12 of these schools, something similar to the Education UK exhibitions.
- 2. The events were well planned, but it would have been more fruitful to have students from class 12 present during the event. The fairs / event should be planned sometime in August / September to capture current school students (class 12).
- 3. It will be a good idea to plan and see if all these institutes along with the students were invited to a central venue. This would have pulled together a lot of prospective students who share a common interest of studying in the UK.
- 4. I think that the mission would prove more successful if the schools were advised that the students we are targeting are those in the penultimate year of studies or at the very earliest, those who are currently sitting their IGCSE and grade 10 exams and wanting advice on what subjects to choose for their IB/A-Levels/Standard XII

Offbeat courses in UK attract Guj students

Looks like students in Gujarat are enthusiastic about studying offbeat courses abroad. Going beyond conventional courses like engineering, medicine and management, delegates from UK universities received queries about courses in funeral management, animal psychology and golf management! Delegates from seven universities in

UK were in Ahmedabad, Vadodara and Rajkot to interact with different schools to inform students about courses being offered in their country. They are University of East Anglia, Glasgow School of Art, University of Greenwich, Kingston University, Leeds Metropolitan University, University of Northampton and Plymouth University.



"Traditionally, parents and students want to know about courses in management, medicine and engineering. This time, queries were received about courses in funeral management, as funerals are big events in UK. "Students willing to settle overseas or NRI stu-dents wanting to go back to these coun-tries are keen to take up such courses," said assistant librarian, Education UK at British Library in the city, Huta Rawal. Dr Satya Shah from University of

Greenwich said some of the other interesting courses offered by varsities in UK are sports branding, animal psychology and golf management. "This time we also received queries for courses in design and fashion technology," he added. UK delegates' visit to Gujarat is part

of 'Schools Mission' where the former inform schools about undergraduate courses offered in UK. But this time, the delegates and Gujarat schools have taken a step forward to consider differ-ent collaborations.

Starting a cultural exchange pro-gramme for Gujarat's schoolchildren and providing teachers training in UK universities were discussed. Joanna Davis from Plymouth University said the delegates would discuss the proposals with seniors in UK.
