



The French Higher Education System

No umbrella organisation but different public & private bodies in charge of international cooperation, which reflects our historical divide between:

- French legislation on internationalization in HE



Key drivers of HE institutions in international cooperation Dauphine University, Paris


- To reach maximum level of student and staff mobility to qualify for the European Universities Initiative
- to become a leading European institution in a specific field of expertise
 e.g. Organizational & Decision Sciences
- to ensure joint training programmes with partner universities at Bachelor's and Master's level
- to strengthen attractiveness through off-site campuses (Tunis in 2009; London in 2014; Casablanca in 2016)
- to encourage the implementation of graduate schools
- to guarantee student employability by working closely with businesses

The UK as a study destination: figures, trends & obstacles

- Increasing mobility within the Erasmus+ programme (student & teacher & staff mobility)
- Stabil attractiveness of the UK as a study destination post-Baccalauréat
 - UCAS figures: French applicants through UCAS were 4820 (January 2019) (+5% change from 2018 but final stats for the 2019 academic year are not yet released)
 - IELTS figures:
 - Slowdown in French IELTS candidates applying to the UK since April, while Canada and Other destinations continue to show positive growth
 - Rise in IELTS applicants for universities in Germany, the Nordics & Denmark offering a large number of courses through EMI.

Obstacles: English Proficiency Index






