### **College of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture**

### 1. History

The College of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture was first established in 1950 as Department of Horticulture of Southwest Agricultural College. The original department was renamed Department of Horticulture of Southwest Agricultural University and College of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture of Southwest Agricultural University in 1985 and 2002, respectively. Finally, in 2005, when Southwest Agricultural University and Southwest Normal University completed the merger as SWU, it was officially promoted as College of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture of SWU. The college is one of the earliest-established core colleges at SWU.
