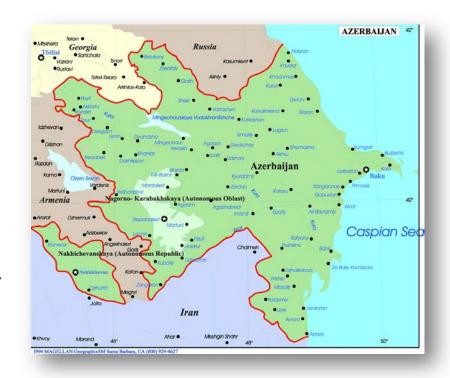

- Establishment date: May 18, 1918
- Independence Day: 18 October 1991
 Official Language: Azerbaijani
- Capital City: Baku
- Legal System: Based on Civil Law System
- Head of State: President
- Head of Government: Prime Minister



Social

- Population 9 111.1 thousand
- Urban population 54,1%
- Population under 19 33.8%
- Population between 20 and 54 54.6%
- Ethnic groups Azerbaijani 91,6%

Participation in education:

Literacy rate – 99,9 % for males and 99.7% for females**

Economic

- Strong GDP growth
- Strong economic indicators over the past ten years. Azerbaijan is a country with one of the fastest growing economies in the world.
- Big infrastructure projects have been implemented, poverty has been reduced from about 50 percent to 6 percent, unemployment is within 5 percent, the external debt 7-8 percent of GDP
- Strong dependency on oil and import

Political

- More than 30 political parties, YAP (New Azerbaijan Party) is a ruling party since 1993
- Balanced foreign policy focus on strengthening relations with neighbouring countries as well as Western countries
- The Nagorno Karabakh conflict with Armenia since 1988. 20% territory is occupied by Armenia.
- Member of UN, CIS, OSCE, European Council, IMF and other international organisations

SWOT Analysis – Strengths

- Education, especially higher education is highly valued by public
- UK Education and perception of its value/quality
- Number of young people who recognize the importance of quality education is increasing
- More demand for Bachelor and Master degrees in the UK
- Parents wish to have children with the western thinking, culture and standards of education
- Increasing demand for the professionals by local companies.
- High demand for summer courses in the UK
- Visa rejection rate is small, there could be problems only with Russian,
 Iranian or Georgian citizens who live, study or work in Azerbaijan

SWOT Analysis – Weaknesses

- Most of local agents are not qualified and specialized. Even some tourism companies offer study abroad services.
- Differences in education systems need for preparation, UK is more academically challenging, plus foundation program is needed to start bachelor degree and scholarship program doesn't support foundation programs.

SWOT Analysis – Opportunities

- 1.83 million of the country population, approximately 19 percentage are between the age of 16-28
- Scholarship programs are offered for young people on education abroad by the government and state and private companies
- Parents generate more income and they are interested in sending their children abroad for educational purposes
- Education level is lower in the country and doesn't meet international organizations and companies requirements
- Science, engineering, tourism, technology becoming priority for the country
- English language is the first language at some schools in Baku

SWOT Analysis – Threats

- Ukraine, Germany, Turkey are very popular among young people, and Australia, USA, Canada, Russia, China are also becoming popular
- The government decreases the number of the UK universities were listed on the state scholarship program.
- The government unwillingness to send students for Economics related courses in the UK.
- Scholarship programs are funded by the State Oil Fund and the situation could be changed if oil prices decreases dramatically as it was in 2008 and 2009
- International joint programs by local universities and professional training and language courses providers will share market size in the upcoming years

Azerbaijan Education Profile

Secondary education – 1 291 317 pupils (2010-2011 academic year) 4 516 schools (18 private schools); 11 years (6-7 till 17-18);

Vocational education – 28 993 students in 59 vocational schools

Higher education – 51 HEIs (15 private institutions); 143 146 students 2010-2011 academic year), Participation in Bologna process since 2010

State Scholarship Program (34 countries, 431 universities, including 27 UK institutions) – UG, PG, research

UK share in the state program: 2012 – 34.2 % of total students, During 5 years in 2007-2012 – 21 % of total students

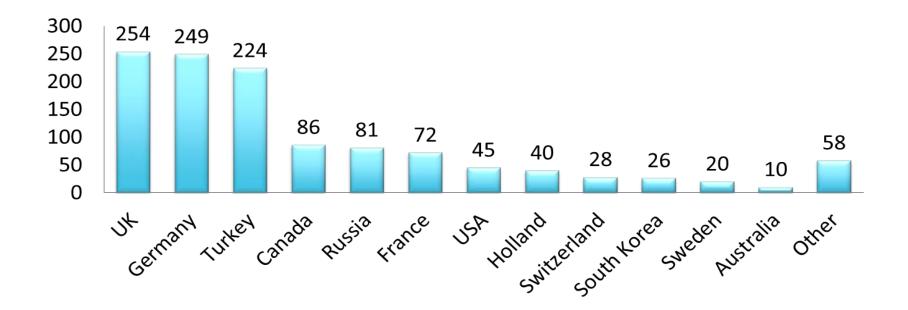
Market for the UK Education

- International qualifications, included the UK Education, are held in high regard in Azerbaijan and are considered to provide individuals with better job prospects.
- The leading market sector for UK education in Azerbaijan is for Bachelor and Master courses and short-term courses (summer schools).
- The most popular subjects for study in the UK are business-related: business studies, economics, finance, accounting, marketing and human resources management
- Online courses for the UK professional qualifications are demanded
- Vocational education is not as developed in the country and there is high demand for joint programs with the UK vocational schools

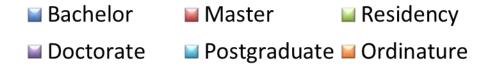
Market trends

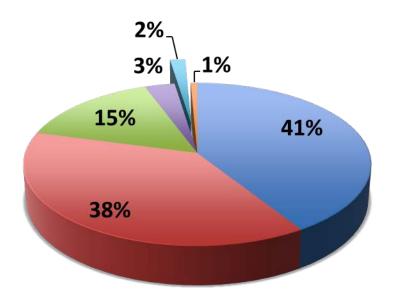
- More than 3 500 official IELTS test takers per year in last few years
- Rising demand for specialized short term courses and language courses in the UK
- ACCA, CIMA, NEBOSH and CIPD are popular among professionals and university students, there are a few official local providers
- Increasing number of local training and course providers recent years, especially with the support of international companies
- International student placement organizations open their offices in Azerbaijan, such as IDP Education, Egitim AI, IGEC and etc.
- Increasing number of students apply for the UK institutions directly
- Young people prefer to go cheaper regions of the UK. London dreams is not so important for them.
- Official statistics for all students study abroad are limited and available statistics related to the state scholarship program

1205 students have been financed by the State Oil Fund of the Republic of Azerbaijan within the framework of the "State Program on education of Azerbaijan youth abroad for the years of 2007-2015" (State program) till the end of 2012. Most of the students under this Program are enrolled in the academic institutions of the UK.



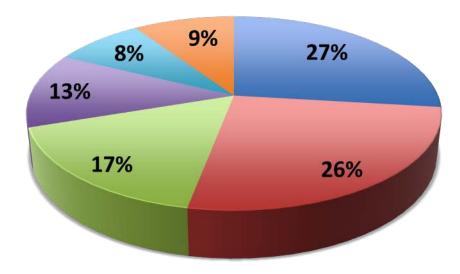
Degree distribution of students study abroad within the state scholarship program in last 5 years:



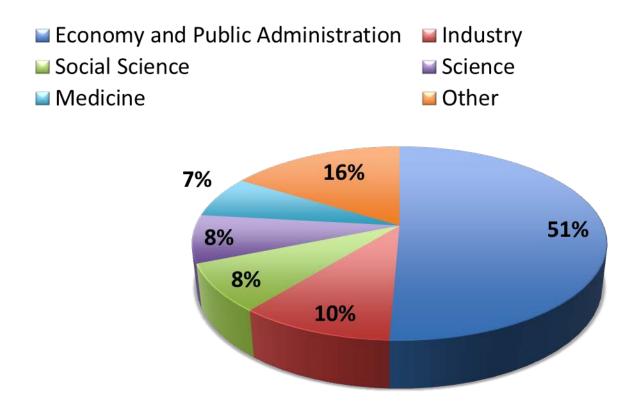


Priority area distribution of students studying abroad at undergraduate level within the state program in last 5 years:

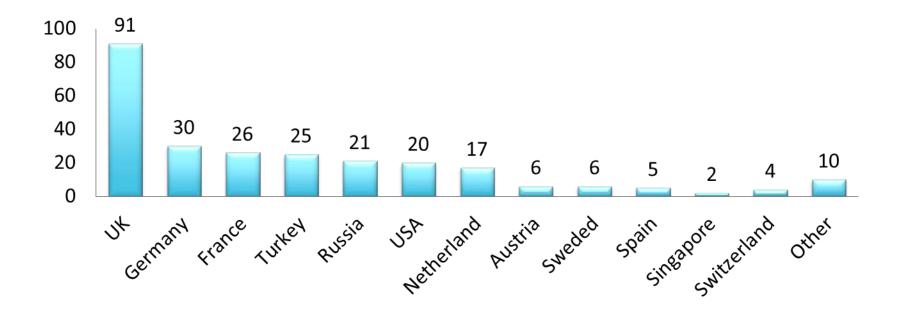




Priority area distribution of students studying abroad at the graduate level within the state program in last 5 years:



266 students were founded by the government within the State Program in 2012. 91 students of them graduated from various universities of the UK. Germany, France, Turkey follow the UK.
