



#### CALL FOR INTEREST -UK-CHINA KNOWLEDGE ECONOMY EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP -REGIONAL AND PROVINCIAL PARTNERSHIPS FOR EXCELLENCE HIGHER EDUCATION MISSION TO JIANGSU AND GUANGDONG

# CONTEXT

This year under the national 'World Class' university initiative substantial funding has been allocated by some provincial governments to support a number of universities improve their position in the national and university world rankings by 2020.

These universities see internationalisation and collaboration with foreign HE institutions as an integral part of their plans to become 'World Class'. Guangdong and Jiangsu provinces are the most advanced in their plans to initiate the 'World Class' University Initiative.

#### Jiangsu

Education is the Jiangsu Government's biggest area of spending, with a budget of GBP2.9 billion in 2016. To support the central government's ambition of building world-class universities and subject areas, Jiangsu Provincial Government aims to propel 15 of its provincial universities into China's top 100 in the national ranking by 2020, and by 2030 Jiangsu aims to be the nation's powerhouse of higher education, with two universities enjoying world-class status.

The Jiangsu Government has earmarked over GBP10 million per annum for international training and collaborations with foreign partners from 2016 – 2020 to support its ambitions.

The Jiangsu Provincial Government is keen to develop a strategic partnership with the UK to set up a platform to discuss and pool collaborative education opportunities with Jiangsu centrally.

An agreement with Jiangsu Provincial government was signed (witnessed by Minister Jo Johnson during his inaugural trip to Suzhou) between Jiangsu Provincial Education Department, UUKi and the British Council to jointly collaborate on the 'World Class' university initiative focusing on joint research, joint PhDs, and doctoral training

## Guangdong

From 1989 to 2015 Guangdong's GDP has ranked number one among all Chinese provinces. However, the quality of higher education in the province has lagged behind other economically advanced regions of China. The Provincial Government sees higher education as playing an essential role in supporting industrial development and maintaining economic growth in the region and is investing heavily in capacity building.

The Guangdong Provincial Government are investing a total of GBP15 million into 10 universities over the 13<sup>th</sup> five year plan period (2016 – 2020) in order to create 'world class' universities. The Provincial Government and the institutions themselves would like to enhance collaborative partnerships with UK HE institutions to support the development of world class universities in the province.

Guangdong Provincial Government feel that research and development (R&D) is as an area where Universities from the UK and Guangdong can work together as the UK HE sector is world renowned for its R&D capacity and Guangdong is establishing itself as a national innovation hub and is well known for the commercial transfer of R&D from its universities.

## PROPOSAL

To participate in a higher education scoping visit to engage with China's "World Class" universities initiative in Jiangsu and Guangdong Province, focusing on establishing joint research, postgraduate transnational education (TNE) programmes and postgraduate training collaboration in healthcare, advanced manufacturing, creative and environmental sectors. UK institutions are only able to participate in the programme in one province, and must therefore either select Guangdong or Jiangsu

# FUNDING

The Department of Business Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) is providing £120,000 in funding for the 'Regional and Provincial – Partnerships for Excellence' project, which is part of the 'UK-China Knowledge Economy Education Partnership (KEEP)' programme.

The funding will be allocated as a travel grant of up to £10,000 to 12 UK HE institutions of which 6 will visit Jiangsu and 6 will visit Guangdong.

The funding is intended to:

- Build regional initiatives linking UK's higher education sector to China's government, education and business communities
- Leverage key domestic Chinese reforms, specifically 'Made in China 2025', 'Healthy China 2030, and the 'World Class Universities Initiative to initiate programmes that will boost research, innovation and academic opportunities.

# UK UNIVERSITY DESIGN

Each university will visit either Guangdong or Jiangsu to participate in the programme outlined above.

Each university will need to at least have a senior representative (PVC or above level) and one other staff participating.

At the end of the scoping visit participating universities should have in writing:

- Agreed objectives with chosen partner organisation/s.
- Action plan for next steps.

## APPLICATION AND ASSESSMENT

Formal applications are invited from UK HE institutions. Applications should include details about the institution, evidence of strength in one or more of the priority areas, specific areas of interest and demonstration of previous successful work with China. Applications should state whether they wish to visit Jiangsu or Guangdong.

Applications are welcome from individual or small groups of universities that would seek to join others in a consortium.

The exact scope of the partnership shall be defined through discussion between the UK institutions and the Chinese institutions, facilitated by the British Council. However, applications should give some indication of the types of activities that they would like to pursue.





# TIMELINE

Applications should be sent to <u>meng.wenjing@britishcouncil.org.cn</u> by close of the day on **6 February 2017.** 

Successful applicants will be informed in the week commencing 13 February 2017.

Partnership grants will be issued by week commencing 20 February 2017.

UK senior representatives should be available to travel to Guangdong or Jiangsu during to meet with senior representatives from the "World Class University Initiative' institutions to discuss their potential collaboration from 13 - 17 March 2017.

#### IMPLEMENTATION

Successful applicants must agree to the terms and conditions which will be stipulated in the agreement. The agreement will be signed with the British Council China.

Funded projects will be expected to provide progress updates and annual achievement reports based on the milestones agreed at the time of approval. A project manager from the British Council China will monitor all projects. The British Council may also commission independent evaluations.

A detailed record of activities, including important communications, documents and spending, must always be kept in case an external audit is carried out.
