



BRITISH COLLEGES WOO PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS IN GABORONE

Over 500 students from different Gaborone high schools flocked to AVANI Hotel Conference Centre over the two days spanning January 30-31, 2017 for the fourth edition of the Education UK Exhibition.

The event, an annual seminar initiated by The British Council, gives different British colleges a platform to exhibit and promote their products in Botswana, had nine institutions in attendance, among them Cardiff Sixth Form College, University of Northampton, Oxford International College and University College of London.

The opening day of the exhibition, which ran from 2pm-5pm, served as an opportunity for local students to have one-on-one interactions with exhibitors.

Such students had to be those in their last year of high school (O level, A level, IB or equivalent) and those who had recently completed such studies. The students, most of whom were from Maru-A-Pula School, Legae Academy, Rainbow High School, among others, had a lot to share about what they had taken from such exchanges.

institution that had exhibited had open chances for every young Motswana to study for anything that may not be available locally.

"There is an array of courses that we may not necessarily have here in Botswana but wish to study for. From what we learned here today, it is quite clear now that the possibilities of such pursuits are not blunt.

Me and my friends wish to go study in the UK, do our best to graduate and definitely come back home to bring that knowledge here and develop this coun-

try!"

When asked what qualifications these colleges required, one other alumni from the same school said, "most of them require a pass of at least one A* and two A's for A Level and with this, for foundation year one can be granted a 50% discount on their tuition fees."

A representative from one of the visiting colleges was questioned on what could be done to fulfil the need that the exhibition is already trying to fill.

"If we can have more course partnerships between UK colleges and those that you have here, and perhaps have sister-schools partnerships as well where students from both countries can do one half of their studies here and the other in the UK or vice versa, then some fruitful results could be harvested in the next file to 10 years of such initiatives."

He also mentioned the need for infrastructural development locally to encourage some of their colleges to open shop here, citing more importance in the local broadband upgrading.

The British High Commission shared on the Chevening Scholarship, a programme that has seen many Batswana students successfully graduate from the UK over the past years. One such notable alumni is Specially Elected Member of Parliament, Hon. Bogolo Kenewendo.

The British Council stall also shed light on IELTS, Cambridge International Examinations, administering examinations for UK institutions, and many more.

The seminar weame to a close with a networking reception at the British High Commissioner's residence from 6pm on the last day. It was here where different stakeholders further expressed interest in getting i to partnerships with local institutions such as Botswana University of Agriculture and Natural Resources (BUAN), BIUST, and OCAAT, among many others.

When the visitors were asked "Did you receive all the Information required to make an informed choice" 95 % said Yes, 5% said No.



- In selecting alumni to represent them, institutions should be confident of the capability and competence of the person (s) they select.
