

### **Post-Event Report**

## British Council Indonesia School Tour September 2016

Jakarta: 26 – 29 September 2016 Surabaya: 30 September 2016

## Introduction

Following the success of previous School Tours held in Indonesia, this year British Council Indonesia held its School Tour in Jakarta and Surabaya, visiting 10 reputable schools with international curriculum.

British Council Indonesia collaborated with each of the host schools to hold a mini exhibition targeting at the students and parents as the key audience.

The host schools were chosen based on their curriculum and numbers of students studying overseas.

The aims of this school tour are as follows:

- To enable students and parents to obtain information directly from the UK Institutions' representatives regarding UK education system in the UK focusing for undergraduate and pathway / foundation programmes,
- To enable UK Institutions to promote their programmes and recruit more Indonesian students to their institutions.
- To strengthen the connection with the host schools by giving supports in providing thorough information regarding UK education system
- To raise awareness of the UK as a chosen study destination with world class education

There were 1,490 students and 260 parents attended the School Tour from 8 host schools in Jakarta and 2 host schools in Surabaya. Feedback from the school counsellors and UK institutions' representatives attended the tour in overall was positive. Presentations on various related topics such as Tips on Writing Personal Statements, Why Study in the UK, How to Apply through UCAS system and UK Visa.

British Council Indonesia undertook a review of the Tour to identify what went well, what did not go well, and the key 'lessons learnt' to inform future activities. With feedbacks from exhibitors and school counsellors, this post-event report presents the results of that review.

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### **British Council School Tour Marketing and Promotion**


The school tour was mainly promoted in collaboration with the host schools. E-flyers email blast, hanging banners, and x-banners were used at each of the host school to promote the event.

Two of the schools in Jakarta and one schools in Surabaya invited students and parents from other schools as well to attend the events.

Most of the schools dedicated certain timing for their students to be able to attend this event, while some schools preferred to merge the British Council School Tour with their internal education and career fairs, which some of them involved other country destinations' institutions. The main reason for the school to merge the event is to give broader choice and opportunity to their students regarding further study options.


The School Tour was held for 5 days with the following schedule

### **Visitors' Profile**




The visitors were mainly students and parents accompanied by the school counsellor(s).


### **Counsellors' Feedback**


We have received feedback from 6 Host Schools Counsellors.

### **Main complaints**


- Limited time at some schools

### Recommendations


- More promotion about study in the UK is needed to raise awareness

### **Exhibitors' Feedback**


We have received 3 feedbacks out of 17 UK Exhibitors for the British Council School Tour 2016.




The Exhibitors are strongly agreed and agreed that the British Council School Tour has met their expectation. One exhibitor chose abstain for this question.

# **Future steps**

There are several areas that both British Council and the UK institutions can work on to improve the overall arrangement and outcomes of the tour. The main findings and recommended next steps are outlined below:

#### **British Council**

- British Council will take into account all the suggestions and recommendations from the Institutions
- British Council will try to negotiate with host school to allocate more time during the mini exhibition
- British Council should allocate time for meeting between school counsellors and UK reps, however this will depend on the host school's capability to accommodate this

### **UK institutions**

- All exhibitors should comply with the policies and deadlines given by the British Council for the tour (eg. Returned the forms).
- All exhibitors should attend at all the host schools, except there is an advance notification so that we can have enough time to inform the host school.
- All exhibitors should follow the school tour schedule due to unpredictable traffic and unforeseen circumstances.
- Both of British Council and UK Institution will put more efforts in raising awareness of UK Education to students and parents.
