Education UK schools and colleges exhibition 2014

19 October 2014 Hong Kong


Introduction

Education UK schools and colleges exhibition held on Sunday 19 October attracted almost 900 people at the Lamham Place Hotel in Mongkok. The event brought representatives from 45 UK schools and further education institutions to meet with Hong Kong students and parents, providing them with information on education opportunities, subject and pathway choices, as well as helping them to make applications for the September 2015 semester.

A series of seminars were held on the day with topics including guardianship, how to choose a boarding school in the UK, education pathways available, as well as truths and myths in school/university application..

The topical seminars and large number of school exhibitors also attracted a lot of media interest, with reporters from top mass-circulation newspapers coming to attend the event.

British Council Hong Kong undertook a review of the fair to identify what went well, what did not go well, and the key 'lessons learnt' to inform future activities. With feedbacks from exhibitors and visitors, together with inputs from British Council colleagues, this post-event report presents the results of that review.




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Visitors' profile




What type of school do/does the visitors/ visitors' child attend?

No. of visitors: n = 99 survey responses

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


From the visitors' survey -


Main compliments

Future steps

There are several areas that both British Council and the UK institutions can work on to improve the overall arrangement and outcomes of the exhibition. The main findings and recommended next steps are outlined below:

British Council

- We will prepare a guide to use the new VRS system and provide alternatives if the exhibitors do not have QR code scanner
- British Council recognises the importance of providing value-added services to the exhibitors, thus we are planning to hold a networking event with local agents, in order to provide a platform for UK institutions and agents to meet up, and identify possible collaboration opportunities.

UK institutions

- Further education colleges should clearly articulate to the audience the subject strengths and sell the benefits of particular courses. Promoting foundation programme or academic routes to higher education would be more effective than vocation route in Hong Kong.
- It would be useful to have at least one Cantonese speaker at the booth, especially for schools and colleges in order to answer enquiries from parents or students who might not be able to communicate fluently in English.
- Institutions should consider localising their school factsheet. It could be a one-pager content about successful alumni stories with university acceptance rates and public examination passing rate.
- The UK institutions, especially for the newcomers of Hong Kong market are recommended to organise other promotional activities leading up to exhibition, which can help to generate more traffic and enquiries during the exhibition.
