- President of Republic Sebastian Pinera
- Estimated Population 17.4 Million
- GDP Total \$320 Billion
- GDP Per Capita \$18,400 55th in the world Highest in Latin America
- One of South America's most stable and prosperous nations
- 5th Largest exporter of wine
- Overall trade profile has traditionally been dependent upon copper exports
- 85% Urban Population
 - Santiago metro 5.8 Million
 - Concepcion 949,000
 - Valparaiso 934,000








Chile

- First South American Nation to join OECD
- Latin Americas highest HDI (.819 in 2012
- Ranked 1st in Latin America for Global Competitive Index
- Economist 2011 ranked business environment as the region's best
- FDI plays a decisive role in Chile



Chilean Student Enrollment Trends





Government incentives for Chilean Students

- Government encourages outbound student mobility
- AGCI
- Chile's Bicentennial Fund for Human Capital Development
- Becas Chile Scholarship
 - energy, biotech, IT, environment, education, health, public policy, mining, aquaculture, food industry, tourism, global services, science and engineering
 - US\$ 6 Billion invested in post graduate study abroad scholarships
 - Previously administered by different ministries and agencies
 - Students must return to Chile
- Exchange Agreements
 - language training and special visas for Chilean students and researchers

- PROCHILE
- Transnational Education

Factors affecting Chilean student recruitment

- Positive factors
 - Economic stability
 - Young population
 - Lack of post graduate programs
 - Becas Scholarship Program -
- Negative factors
 - Foreign language proficiency
 - Credit transfer system unclear Not part of NARIC



Argentina – General Information

- President Cristina Fernandez de Kirchner
- 2012 Estimated Population 41 Million
- GDP Total \$474 Billion
- GDP Per Capita \$11,572 62nd in the world
- Considered an emerging market one of G20 major economies
- High inflation weakness for decades
- Manufacturing is the largest sector half of exports in agriculture
- Largest Cities
 - Buenos Aires 3.0 Million
 - Cordoba 1.4 Million
 - Rosario 1.2 Million









- No specific strategies and policies to promote outgoing international student mobility
- Broad policy to internationalize higher education
- Education Ministry
 - Study in Argentina website
- Focus on integration into MERCOSUR

Argentine Institutions

- Social justice program most institutions are tuition free
- Limited internationalization programs
- Competition with other Latin American countries in inbound recruitment
- Cutbacks in spending in the '80s and '90s

Factors affecting Argentine student recruitment

- Positive
 - Economic development has improved
 - Some study abroad programs
 - Relatively low presence of TNE
 - EU efforts to develop a common credit system with Latin America
- Negative
 - Lack of English competence
 - Lack of institutional promotion of education programs abroad
 - Lack of clear government policy strategy




Venezuela – General Information


- President Nicolas Maduro
- Population 2011 29 Million
- GDP Total \$345 Billion
- GDP Per Capita \$11,500
- Among the most urbanized populations in Latin America
- One of world's leading exporters of oil
- Suffered during the 2008 global financial crisis but
- economy returned to growth as of late 2010





Education in Venezuela

- Administered and regulated by the Ministry of Education
- Basic education followed by specialized education
 - All public education is free but private education is popular
- Bolivarian Missions Social Outreach Program
- Bolivarian University of Venezuela
 - Goal of enrolling 1 million students nationwide
 - Social Missions Network
- Chavez's Bolivarian Curriculum

Problems faced by Autonomous Universities

- Autonomous universities now severely underfunded
- Challenges for the new leadership
- Brain drain
 - 2009 outflow of highly skilled labor, aged 25 or older, from Venezuela to OECD countries rose 216 percent between 1990 and 2007
 - 2008 47 percent of 18-year-olds said they planned to emigrate in the next three years

Barriers for UK in recruiting Venezuelans

- Lack of foreign language proficiency
- Financing UK tuition
- Accessing foreign currency
 - CADIVI Foreign Exchange Administration Commission
 - Foreign currency access limited to students studying basic sciences, engineering/ architecture and technology, agriculture and marine sciences, health sciences, education, sport sciences, social sciences or literature/the arts
 - Black market


Peru – General Information

- President Ollanta Humala
- Population 2013 Estimate 30.4 Million
- GDP Total (nominal) \$220 Billion
- GDP per Capita \$7,135
- Developing country Poverty level around 28.7%
- Economic activities include agriculture, fishing, mining, and manufacturing
- Economy of Peru upper middle income






Peruvian Student Enrollment Trends


