Country profile - Kuwait

Government of Kuwait

- 1. Kuwait is a constitutional emirate with a semidemocratic political system.
- 2. The political system is divided between an elected parliament and appointed government.
- 3. The Constitution of Kuwait, approved in November 1962.
- 4. The head of state is the Amir/Sheikh (Sabah Al Ahmed Al Sabah).
- 5. Key positions held by members of ruling family System of government is monarchical and constitutional.
- 6. The number of the assembly members is 50, chosen by people every 4 years through free and fair elections
- 7. Minister of Higher Education, Dr Saud Al Harbi

Kuwait 2019 population is estimated at **4,207,083** people at mid year according to UN data.

Kuwaitis are 1,262,126

Kuwait population is equivalent to **0.05%** of the total world population.

Kuwait ranks number 129 in the list of countries (and dependencies) by population.

The population density in Kuwait is **236 per Km2** (611 people per mi2).

Growth Rate is 1.69 %





AGE GROUP'S SHARE OF TOTAL POPULATION












Country profile - Kuwait

Economy

Despite the drag from OPEC-led oil output cuts, growth recovered in 2018, rising to 1.2% following a 3.5% contraction in 2017. The improvement continued in the first quarter 2019, with the economy expanding by 2.6% year-on-year (y/y) amid strong non-oil growth (of 4.1% y/y). High frequency indicators suggest that consumer spending improved in the first half of 2019, helped by strong public sector hiring, in turn supporting service sector activity. Notwithstanding broadly flat oil output, oil sector GDP rose 1.3% y/y in Q1, likely reflecting growth in refining output. Kuwait is the fifth largest OPEC oil producer, and oil production averaged 2.69mbd in the first half of 2019 versus an OPEC+ mandated target of 2.72mbd: in July, OPEC+ supply cuts were extended for another nine months until end-March 2020.

GDP per capita/year in Kuwait is expected to reach 73,000 USD by the end of 2020.










Kuwait Education Structure


- Current school attendance over 700,000 + with significant

Kuwait University

- Established in 1966
- 16 colleges
- The New Campus launched recently "Sabah Al-Salem Kuwait University City- Shadadiyah"
- Currently enrols approx. 27,890 students
- of which 69% female
- 65 academic programs for UG students
- Offers PG in most disciplines
- 1,512 PG produced in last few years
- Graduate Degrees Duration: 4-5 years, PG Two year +

The university has 30 departments I in all in the following colleges Arts; I Commerce, Economics, and Political I Science; Engineering and I Petroleum; Law; Islamic Law (sharii I 'a) and Islamic Studies; Medicine; I Allied Health and Nursing; Science; I Education; Graduate Studies; and I the Women's College.








Kuwait Higher Education – Public Universities

The new campus is being built to accommodate up to 40,000 students with colleges for arts, humanities, sciences, engineering and medical specialties.

The medical campus will incorporate five medical colleges, in addition to a research center and a 600-bed university teaching hospital.










HE – Market trends Students by HE Providers 2017/2018








Popular UK institutions among Kuwaiti Undergraduates in 2019











Popular UK institutions among Kuwaiti Postgraduates in 2019











Top 10 Subject areas: First Degree




Dr. Fatimah Alhashem


