Background

The British Council in Kuwait has been approached by a local education provider, seeking assistance with their existing English language programme. The client operates academies in Kuwait, which aim to provide an enhanced education stream to gifted students, who have been identified and selected from the Kuwaiti state education system.

There is currently 1 academy with plans to open a further 5 academies (3 for boys and 3 for girls) in 2017 across 3 educational districts in Kuwait (acting as hubs for the other districts).

The client approached the British Council to seek assistance with developing its current English language programme. Their stated aim for the English programme is "Developing the language competency of pupils from form 9 so that student's reach a proficiency approximately IELTS band 5.5 on leaving school".

Project Overview

The project requires that a consultant is engaged to carry out a review of the existing English language programme at the existing academy.

It is proposed that this review would require a 1 week period on-site for gathering information, reviewing the existing teaching methodology and curriculum, current teacher competency levels, on-going assessment and testing practices.

The consultant will collate their findings from the on-site period and will then present them in a report, along with recommendations for how the existing programme can be improved.

It is planned that the 1 week on-site period will be during June 2017.

Interested UK organisations should submit a proposal to the British Council Kuwait, providing information on the methodology they propose to use, background information on similar pieces of work that have been undertaken, a CV of the consultant that will be engaged to conduct the review and present the final report, along with cost (please do not include logistical cost these will be organised by the British Council)
