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

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



- 2. Cultural awareness and Restorative Practice: as case study
- 'David' a young man from an African Country had a dream to study his MSc in Psychology in the UK. This was his first time leaving the country.
- A curious learner and conscious & industrious student, David has soon made friends and joined the Facebook course student and staff Forum.
- Halfway through his studies David posted a video on the Forum which involved people back from his hometown aggressively calling for violent attacks on all those who support or have self-identify as non-heterosexual.
- What are the actions we needed to take as the host institution in the UK?

Local and International Perspective

Cultural awareness and Restorative Practice: as case study

- When the University responded, David's response was stunned, confused, embarrassed, and remorseful. "In my community, we believe this to be the truth. What have I done wrong?"
- Restorative Justice is an ethos and a process whereby a harm is being restored: Goals are identified so as to increase the offender's understanding of the harm caused via voluntary & honest dialogue
- Developmental and practical measures are identified so as to attempt to put right a wrong (often in addition to necessarily punitive measures)
