

Schools Mission Kathmandu Post-event report 03 - 04 March 2014

British Council Nepal organized its first ever schools mission in Kathmandu on 3rd and 4th March 2014. During the two day school mission, eight renowned UK institutes participated to visit top five A level schools of Nepal.



On the first day of the event, universities' delegates visited three schools Trinity, Little Angel's and St. Xavier's followed by Chelsea and Rato Bangla School on the second day. In total, 1160 students participated in the various activities that were organised as part of the schools mission.

Our first school mission has made a positive impact on both the participating UK institutions and Local A Level schools thus creating a strong foundation. The response from both the parties described their experience as "worthwhile" and also highlighted that the "quality and number of students attending was remarkable." In terms of improvements for the future learning was that schools mission should not take place very close to a big promotion event such as the Education UK exhibition to ensure higher levels of participation.

"I found high quality students in this mission. They were enquiring about a range of courses from Computer Science, Engineering, to Animation. The school mission gives us the opportunity to better understand students' interests in Nepal. It is up to the British Council to take this forward so that it becomes a must have event in the calendars of UK institutions and local schools" expressed Jeanette Baker, Representative from Sheffield Hallam University.

In addition, the comments from delegates to improve the event at the final day are as follows:

- Should select more high quality school for the mission.
- Change the format of mission. Allow more time for table top exhibition rather introduction and presentation from each university.
- Do not clash with big event like exhibition. Students are repeated for mission and exhibition.
- Should engage the school counsellor by introducing session with school's counsellor.

Highlights from the event

This was the first time that a School Mission has been organized by BC SIEM Nepal. The event was successful in motivating other new prospective schools to be involved in the mission
