Twelve months of continued consultative engagement with the UK- PK HE sector culminated in <u>a 4-day launch ceremony</u> with the most senior UK delegation in Pakistan in Nov 2018, an investment worth GBP 2 Million – an equal contribution from HEC and the British Council. - 4. Distance Learning and New Ways of Delivery of Higher Education

GOING GLOBAL

More than 950 leaders in higher education, business and government attended the British Council's 13th annual Going Global conference, taking place in Berlin from the 13th to the 15th May 2019. Over 85 countries are represented by delegates, including vice-chancellors, pro vice-chancellors, and government ministers.

Pak-UK Education Gateway was promoted at the conference in May 2019. Dr. Tariq Banuri, Chairman Higher Education Commission, met with various stakeholders and discussed ways to strengthen academic partnerships between the world and Pakistan against the example set by Pak-UK Education Gateway.

In the session revolving around "Digital collaboration to sustain global research" on the 2nd day of the conference, the research culture in Pakistan to strengthen engagement with the public through digital was also discussed among other themes.

PAKISTAN SCOTTISH SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME 2019-20

The Pakistan Scottish Scholarship Scheme first launched in 2013 aims to assist Pakistani women – all committed to not only improving their futures but also contributing to the economic and social betterment of Pakistan – to pursue higher education. Last year alone, over 6000 exceptional young women from across Pakistan applied for consideration. These impactful scholarships have thus so far supported over 700 women to pursue

education at master's level in areas such as food security, education, health and STEM, all of critical importance to Pakistan.

OPPORTUNITIES

• Exploratory Grants | 10 June 2019

These will be open to universities and independent researchers who aim to initiate research partnerships. This scoping study will help you to secure funding when opportunities are available for research projects.

• Mobility grants for Faculty and Students | 10 September 2019

To improve the two-way international mobility in HE between UK and Pakistani by providing placement opportunities to faculty and students from both countries for cultural, creative, and intellectual exchange.

Collaborative Research Grants | October 2019

The British Council in Pakistan and HEC will jointly announce a call for multilateral research partnerships between Pakistan and the UK universities and research bodies and existing centers of excellence. The purpose of the research grants is to create collaboration clusters and hubs between both countries.

What should you do?

We recommend that our stakeholders prepare for the upcoming opportunities well before we make the announcements. This process would generally include identifying your institution's needs, making the first contact with potential partners, i.e., identifying UK organizations that can potentially contribute to your areas of interest and forming a project plan in advance. You might also want to contact local third-parties to form a consortium to execute the proposed research partnership.
