



- Universities 1 October end of June
- Language schools follow school year

Non-public 325

<u>Fees</u>

Public institutions free for Polish citizens; for international students - about EUR 2000 per year

Non-public institutions - from EUR 2000 to 6000 (medical and MBA from EUR 8000 to 12000)

Both sectors charge fees for the courses delivered in foreign languages (both domestic and international students)

- Positive GDP growth rate but slowing down

A large internal market, European Union cohesion policy funding and growing Foreign Direct Investments

- Inflation rate (annual) 3.7 (UK 2.8)
- Unemployment general 13.4 in 2012
- Youth unemployment 27.5 (UK 20; Germany 7.9; Austria 8)
- Public expenditure on education 5,1 % of GDP in nominal value
- School drop-out rate 5%
- Students planning to study in HE institutions 86%
- Students selecting English as a foreign language at school 96%


- Quality

What motivates Polish students to study in the UK?


British universities highest in students' ranking in Polish Open University Survey (2011):

- The best prospects for employment (over 51 %)
- MA from UK university is highly regarded by Polish employers and is an advantage in job application according to 77%

Regional distribution of Polish students in the UK




Region of institution, Nationality, Country of Domicile



Interest in Boarding Schools

- About 500 Polish students in the UK boarding schools system
- Boarding Schools Scholarships Scheme run by British Alumni Society in Poland for the second year
 10 candidates per place offered by the UK Schools
- Poznan International Education Fair (March 2013) and Warsaw (2012) boarding schools present for the first time
- Media tour to the UK to raise interest in Poland in UK boarding schools
- Students 16-18 most likely to study in boarding schools





Demographics and its impact on the system


- The number of young people under 24 is about 12 million and decreasing (population of Poland over 38 million)
- The number of young people between 16-18 about 1,5 million. In 2020 it will decrease to about 1 million



Demographics and its impact on the system

- Closure of many schools and HE institutions (especially non-public)
- Growing competition among schools and HE institutions
- Acceptance of students at the cost of lowering/changing admission standards
- Competing for international students growing offer of courses delivered in foreign languages
- Opportunities for TNE, joint and dual degrees, also on-line; joint research
- New opportunities for Higher Vocational Schools in Poland new developing market for the UK FE Colleges
