










Indonesia has a population dividend







Indonesia will see a relatively large increase labour force






Slower growth seen in competitor markets in recent years






Economic performance lagging recently

Economic performance

- GDP growth slowed to 4.7% year on year in January—June
- Household consumption moderated in response to higher inflation and tighter consumer credit
- Inflation down slightly to average 6.9% year on year in the first 8 months
- Exports fell by 12.4% in US dollars in the first half

Medium term outlook mixed

Outlook

- Consumption will benefit in 2016 from somewhat lower inflation and from pay raises for the civil service
- External demand is also seen improving in 2016
- ADP forecasts that growth will dip in 2015 and recover in 2016



Branch campus model?

- Article 90 of Law No 12 of 2012 on HE allows and provides for foreign branch campus on a non-profit basis, in partnership with an Indonesian HEI and prioritising Indonesian academic staff
- In 2013 the Constitutional Court found in favour of foreign HE campus

Branch campus model in practice prohibited

- Implementation of article 90 of Law No 12 of 2012 requires
 a Ministerial Regulation which has yet to be issued
- Ministry of Education Regulation 14 of 2014 on HE Cooperation does not recognize branch campus models
- A foreign company is **not** considered not for profit and HEIs must be organised on a non-profit basis



Ownership of a private university?

 The 2014 negative investment list allows up to 49% foreign ownership of a private university, in line with article 90 of Law No 12 of 2012 on HE

Foreign ownership prohibited

 Under Capital Investment legislation, foreign investment in Indonesia must be in the form of a limited company

 Law 12 of 2012 and MOE Regulation 95 of 2014 require a private university to be established by a non-profit organisation.

 A foreign company is not considered a non-profit organization and the establishment of private university by a foreign company is not enforceable

 Dikti has suggested an application for the establishment of a private university will not be accepted if the foundation has a foreigner on its Executive Board

Franchise model?

- Foreign franchises generally allowed and provided for under Minister of Trade Regulation No. 53/M-DAG/PER/8/2012 on the Implementation of Franchising; and Minister of Trade Regulation No 7/M-DAG/PER/9/2014 (strong emphasis on local sourcing)
- Examples of foreign owned education franchises exist.

Franchises

MoE Regulation No. 14 of 2014 on HEI Cooperation doesn't recognize HEI cooperation in franchise models.

Law 12 of 2012, MOE Regulation 95 of 2014 and Law No. 20
of 2003 on the National Education System states that formal
education must be organised on a non-profit basis

Franchises are understood to be for profit

Distance and online degrees?

- Indonesian students have and do sign up for online and distance courses by overseas providers
- Frequent requests from Indonesian universities and government departments for support in online provision
- Increased interest in online and distance delivery of professional qualifications

Distance and online degrees?

- Only Universitas Terbuka is allowed to provide distance and online degrees, in accordance with Dikti Circular Letter No. 2630/D/T/2000 and with reference to Government Regulation 30 of 1990 and Government Regulation 57 of 1998
- Dikti will not recognise and legalise degrees if gained through distance or online learning. For people wishing to work in the public sector this is problematic

Twinning? Allowed but not implemented


According to MoE Regulation No. 14 of 2014 on HEI Cooperation, twinning, where a Main Campus from 'country A' partners with an existing local campus/institution in 'country B' to develop an articulation system that that allows students to take course credits at local Institutions and/or Main Campus is allowed. However there are no examples of twinning and Dikti never promotes this model



TNE models that are allowed and encouraged

Allowed and accommodated under MOE Regulation No. 14 of 2014 on HEI Cooperation and further regulated under Dikti Guidelines:


- Joint degree most popular option, one certificate
- Regular double degree (BA and MA), two certificates
- Accelerated double degree (MA and PhD), two certificates
- Credit transfer and credit earning
- Joint supervision
- Research collaboration
- Academic and student exchanges





Looking forward

- Rumours that the Ministerial Decree to allow branch campus model will be issued
- Dikti promoting joint/double degrees
- Dikti/Ristek Dikti is interested in online provision, esp to reach remote areas
- Fear of privatisation of state universities 'by stealth' and of foreign influence remains
- ASEAN Common Market will drive changes in attitude and practice

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


