- Any other member of staff involved in pastoral care, and who is in touch with international students during school life.



Some schools may have some or all of these staff members – submit as many or as few as you see fit.

We would like profiles to be written in a personal, relaxed and approachable way. Some things to consider might be:

- A short 'day in the life' that explains what exactly you do and your contact with students, particularly international students (e.g. what students call you...).
- Your background and qualifications e.g. did you used to be a subject teacher and become head? Were you an NHS nurse who became a school nurse?
- What you enjoy most about your job.
- How you support students
- Advice for students or potential students (e.g. what to bring with them, things to consider if they're nervous, etc.)
- Anything that highlights why boarding school education is particularly good in the UK.

- \* Any students or individuals featured are happy for us to use their images.
- \* Any pictures of under-18s come with written consent from a guardian (e.g. teacher).

(Please note that copyright is usually owned by the photographer of the image and only he/she can grant permission for others to use their work.)

## Style guidance

Please write in fluid prose (not bullet points) and use plain English. Write as if you are having a conversation and avoid corporate-speak. It's best to keep the language simple for students who are learning English.

We will credit you as author and link to your institution, but we cannot include any other details here which promote your institution. We hope you understand.
