

Post-event report for Study UK Partnership Forum and Mini Fair 2017 7 July 2017 Accra

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide you with a summary of the event, visitor and exhibitor feedback as well as other useful information. We trust that this report will enable you to report return on investment and assist with future decision making.

The events "Study UK Partnership Forum" hosted representatives from 17 UK universities and representatives from 22 Ghanaian universities and government agencies (listed below in the Exhibitors' feedback section) who participated in the partnership forum. The "Mini Fair" hosted these 17 UK university representatives who engaged with prospective students, professionals and parents in Accra, providing the audience with information on the studying opportunities in the UK (Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes, admissions, funding, etc.).

The events helped to build brand awareness for Study UK and the UK universities who took part in the events. Our direct marketing and social media campaign (details listed below in the Marketing section) also provided a lot of awareness and publicity for the events. The partnership forum had in attendance the Director at the Tertiary section of the Ministry of Education, Ghana who represented the Minister of State in charge of Tertiary Education, the Programme Manager at the ministry of Business Development who also represented the Minister and the Executive Secretary of the National Accreditation Board (list of Ghanaian universities listed below in the exhibitors feedback section).

The mini fair which started in the evening attracted over **300 visitors** thanks to the marketing campaign. Alongside the fair, series of presentations were also delivered by Alumni of UK universities on how studying in the UK has impacted their entrepreneurial journey and an officer from the Scholarships team at the British Council provided information on how to apply for a Commonwealth and Chevening scholarship.

At British Council we highly appreciate your support, and hope that we can continue to provide valuable marketing services in terms of both our exhibitions and also our range of other targeted activities during the year. We hope to see you again at our second mini exhibition: **Study UK International Schools Tour and PG Fair** in Accra scheduled for September 2017.






Accra Attendees' Profile

55% students, 25% professionals, 2% Academic 59% male, 28% female




47% of visitors plan to study in the UK in 1 year






Top 5 Motivating Factors for studying in the UK:







Exhibitor's Feedback


At the Partnership Forum there were <u>17 unique exhibitors</u> from UK HEIs and <u>24 Ghanaian HEI's</u> in attendance.


When exhibitors were asked "Will you be attending a similar exhibition next year?" 67% said yes, 33% are undecided.


















Overall Summary of Exhibitors expectations:



Some positive quotes from exhibitors:

- Food was delicious

- The "speed networking" was great at the partnership forum but should be held in a bigger room next time instead of the smaller meeting rooms.

Some negative quotes from exhibitors:

- · Venue was a bit small
- Difficulty in identifying various local universities that were present at the partnership forum

Future steps

There are a number of areas that both the British Council and the UK institutions can work on to improve the overall arrangement and outcomes of the exhibition. The main findings and recommended steps are outlined below:

British Council

- For next year's exhibition, we will evaluate the cost effectiveness and the feasibility of moving to a larger venue and possibly changing the exhibition format itself.
- Depending on our venue capacity and budget constraints, we will consider an exhibitors' lounge where coffee, tea and light refreshments will be served.
- Going forward, British Council (Ghana) will coordinate schedules better with the region and tie-in our exhibition with other regional countries' events, to enable exhibitors maximize their time and budget in a single trip.
- Going forward, Institutions will be provided with internet modems to use at the exhibition

UK Institutions

- It is suggested that institutions invite their alumni to sit with them at their stands and share real life experiences with the prospective applicants
- It is suggested that institutions read the Exhibition Handbook and also take note of their itinerary provided in their welcome pack and emails sent ahead of time
- Many visitors commented that scholarships opportunities were very low. We recommend institutions to look at ways of providing some sort of scholarship or discount and highlight these during future exhibitions

The above points, though important, should not detract from what was a successful exhibition. The upcoming exhibition (Currently Scheduled for September 2017) will build upon the lessons learned and prove even more popular. We hope to see you there!
