

PUBLIC LECTURE

Alfred Russel Wallace is a shared UK-Indonesia legacy. He, along with Charles Darwin, is credited with conceiving the theory of evolution through natural selection. Wallace's seminal work, The Malay Archipelago, is mainly born out of his meticulous observation of faunal diversity in a transitional region now named after him, Wallacea, in eastern Indonesia. Wallacea is one of the most ecologically diverse region on the planet.

Science is what brought Wallace to Indonesia. And through his eight years criss-crossing across the archipelago, he also saw and recorded social and cultural diversity of Indonesia –highly relevant topics which can provide insights for Indonesia's development.

PUBLIC LECTURE – THE SESSION

Keynote speech:

GEORGE BECCALONI

A zoologist, evolutionary biologist, and historian of science. Affiliation: Director of the Wallace Correspondence Project, worked as entomologist at London's Natural History Museum for 20 years.

PROF. SANGKOT MARZUKI

Former President of the Indonesian Academy of Science (AIPI), and Director of Eijkman Institute for Molecular Biology (1992 – 2014).

PUBLIC LECTURE – THE SESSION

There will be **four sessions** exploring different topics related with Wallacea region.

SESSION ONE: FOOD, NUTRITION AND HUMAN GENETICS

It will explore how local/traditional food linked with biodiversity resources, and how it influences nutrigenomics and health of people

SESSION TWO: CONNECTIVITY AND CONSERVATION

Islands of Wallacea region are now more connected due to latest infrastructure projects, attracting business and investment in the region as a result. Can we manage and sustain biodiversity of Wallacea region? How?

SESSION THREE: CULTURAL DIVERSITY

It will explore how biodiversity may influence cultural expression of people in Wallacea region.

SESSION FOUR: SCIENCE AND SOCIETY
