UK - Spain collaboration in higher education

The British Council is keen to promote cooperation between UK and Spanish higher education institutions in activities such as research, student and staff exchanges and the delivery of programmes in Spain (TNE), including for joint and double degree. The importance of the UK-Spanish relationship is illustrated by the following annual data:

- Over 8,800 Spanish students follow full programmes in UK HEIs (postgraduates make up one third of these);
- 2,700 Erasmus students from UK study in Spain and 3,500 Spanish Erasmus students are in UK HEIs;
- Over 4,000 Spanish students follow UK degree programmes in Spain;
- There are very extensive research links between the two countries.

Towards understanding what support might be most appropriately provided, the British Council, Spain, would like to learn more about the total mix of activities involving UK and Spanish HEIs, both current and planned, and wishes to identify:

- existing collaboration and other activities involving UK and Spanish HEIs;
- those activities UK and Spanish HEIs prioritise for their future collaboration.

To achieve this we would request you to complete the questionnaire below. It is our intention to follow-up responses, as appropriate, by contacting institutions and individuals directly, through email or phone, as we would like to understand more clearly motivations and constraints as well as provide case studies.

In parallel we are conducting a similar exercise with Spanish institutions, including learning more of the Spanish regulatory environment, as well as exploring the motivations and support for Spanish universities to grow international partnerships.

Following this research the British Council will present its findings through a seminar and a report. Note that we will be covering research partnerships separately, although we would welcome information from universities in UK and Spain on any significant UK-Spain research cooperation.
